Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the new school year. We begin our term with a focus on Creation, thanking God for all that He has done for us and how we can best look after His beautiful world.

The beginning of November marks a time to remember those who have gone before us into the loving embrace of God. We then move towards the season of Advent when we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

As the first teachers of faith to your children, you will find a list of suggestions for home activities to support their RE learning. Please do send in pictures or pieces of work to be shared and celebrated with the school community.

Branch 1 – Creation and Covenant

'The heavens are telling the glory of God' (Ps 19:1). In this branch, pupils will encounter the God who creates and calls a people. They will explore revelation of the Christian belief that all that is comes from God, the Creation accounts in Genesis, and scientific explanations of the process of Creation. They will explore the call of God and his covenantal relationship with his people first through Abraham and Moses, then through the narrative of the Old Testament. **To Know You More Clearly – Religious Education Directory – Page 62**

Branch 2 – Prophecy and Promise

'In many and various ways, God spoke to our ancestors by the prophets' (Heb 1:1). The prophets speak of God reaching to his people, calling them back into a relationship with him. In this branch, pupils will explore the Christian understanding of the teaching of the prophets as they point to the fulfilment of God's promise in a messiah, Jesus Christ. They will explore the expectant waiting for the Messiah through the Advent season and how this speaks to Christians today as they wait for Christ. Pupils will encounter the story of the nativity of Jesus and the mystery of the incarnation. **To Know You More Clearly – Religious Education**

Advent (Begins Sunday 1st December)

Advent means 'coming'. We think of the coming of Jesus when he was born but we also think of his promise that he would come again at the end of time. It is a time of waiting and preparing. It is only in the last week of Advent that we focus upon the events to be celebrated at Christmas. **The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary** (9th December)

This feast marks the first stage of the existence of Mary, the mother of Jesus. She was 'full of grace' from the very beginning and devoted herself to God throughout her life.

Christmas Day, The Nativity of the Lord (25th December)

On this day, we begin our celebration of the birth of Christ.
